





There is no doubt that the Gulf Coast has some of the best beaches anywhere in the world; in fact, Clearwater Beach has been ranked by Dr. Beach as the number-one beach in the world many years running. There is never a loss of things to do in Clearwater. If

you're looking for an adventurous happening place where all the tourists go, then this beach is your pick. However, there are so many beautiful beaches in the area each offering its own style; you might want to check out where the locals soak up the sun.



Indian Shores / Tiki Gardens

This public-access beach is situated on 9.9 acres and offers restrooms, beach showers, a water fountain, and a 170-space parking area (parking fee charged).

Clearwater Beach

Clearwater Beach is one of the most beautiful (and most popular) beaches in the country. In fact, it's consistently ranked as one of the top beaches in the U.S. by authorities like TripAdvisor and Travel and Leisure. And it's no surprise why – the wide, sweeping, white-sand beach is absolutely stunning. And the warm, calm waters of the Gulf of Mexico are just unbeatable.

Caladesi Island State Park

This beautiful state park is located just off offshore from Dunedin and can be accessed by ferry, which operates 365 days a year and only costs \$6 per person (well worth the cost).

Caladesi Island State Park has a marina with floating docks with 30-amp electric service and water hookups. A covered pavilion with a grill is available for picnicking. A snack bar and gift shop are located in the marina. Some of the amenities include fishing, hiking, paddle boarding, picnicking, and swimming. Canoes and kayaks are available for rent.

Indian Rocks Beach

While all of the tourists are stacked deep at Clearwater Beach, most locals head for the white sandy dunes of Indians Rocks Beach, where there are usually very few people on the beach, and you'll be able to spread out and enjoy a peaceful relaxing experience. After a long day at the beach, head to the original Crabby Bills on Gulf Boulevard at Fourth Avenue North for a premium adult beverage and a dozen fresh succulent oysters to start. Sit back and relax while listening to live music at their outdoor bar where a full menu is available for dinner. 1700 Gulf Blvd., Indian Rocks Beach, FL 34635

Honeymoon Island Beach State Park

One of Florida's best-loved state parks, Honeymoon Island has more than four miles of beach to explore along with a three-mile trail through one of the last remaining virgin slash pine forests. A natural barrier island, this state park boasts pristine nature trails and abundant wildlife, including eagles, osprey, and great horned owls. Ground animals include raccoons, armadillos, and don't be surprised to see an endangered gopher tortoise walking across your path or hear the call of an osprey—or the bark of Fido, who may explore the dog beach, which is a half-mile hike off the main road. The Pinellas Trail has a spur that runs the length of the Dunedin Causeway right to the park entrance.

Taylor Park consists of 156.5 acres, including a 53-acre freshwater lake.

Amenities include a ball field, boat ramp (non-motorized), disc golf, fishing, picnic area, playground equipment, restrooms, seven picnic shelters with grills, and is located on the Pinellas Trail.

Eagle Lake Park

Great care was given to the restoration of the land's natural habitat during the park's development.

One key feature is a wetlands section on the western side of the park, which has been restored with 100-percent native plants. The park is home to fox squirrels, numerous bird species, gopher tortoises, and water turtles.

Amenities include six picnic shelters, three restrooms, playground, dog park, a paved 12-foot wide recreation trail, numerous shell paths for walking and enjoying nature, 2,000 feet of boardwalks over restored wetlands, fishing, three vending stations

Sand Key Beach State Park

This beautiful park has two distinct areas—a beach and a park. In the park proper are two picnic shelters with grills, a playground, a restroom, and a dog park. Grills, picnic tables, and water fountains are but a few amenities.

A salt marsh with viewing benches further enhances the park where heron, roseate spoonbill, great horned owl, anhinga, and common moorhen nest and feed.

Sand Key Park houses the base of operations for the artificial reef program, an interdepartmental cooperation program to build a reef in the Gulf. Sand Key Park's natural communities include a beach where sea turtles annually deposit eggs.

Amenities include a concession booth, boardwalk, nature trail, two beach wheelchairs, outdoor showers, two bathhouses with separate changing stalls and restrooms, parking (fee charged), dog park, playground, restrooms, two shelters with grills, umbrella and cabana rentals as well as kayak and bicycle rentals.

Largo Central Park Nature Preserve

Largo Central Park Nature Preserve (LCPNP) is a 31-acre nature park virtually surrounded by water. The park is home to hundreds of wildlife species for viewing. Over 130 species of birds, otters, red fox, American alligator, marsh rabbits, wild turkey, and bats all feed or live within the park. A 5-mile kayak/canoe route begins at the park and ends at Park Boulevard. Due to environmental reasons fishing is not allowed at the park. Dogs are not allowed. 150 Highland Ave. N., Largo, FL 33770

John R. Bonner Nature Park

This park is Largo's best-kept secret! Bonner Park is on the Great Florida Birding Trail because of its diverse migratory bird population. Bonner Park features picnic facilities, nature trails, a playground, and a covered pavilion. This beautiful park overlooks the waterway.

► CLEARWATER MARINE AQUARIUM

Clearwater Marine Aquarium is a nonprofit organization and aquarium in Clearwater. It is dedicated to the rescue, rehabilitation, and release of sick and injured marine animals, public education, conservation, and research.

Clearwater Marine Aquarium opened in 1972 at its current location on Clearwater Beach, in a former water treatment plant (the large pools being well-suited for rehabilitation operations).

Numerous forms of marine life are permanent residents at the aquarium, all of which have serious injuries that prevent their return to the wild.

The aquarium's best-known permanent resident was Winter, a bottlenose dolphin who was rescued in December 2005 after having her tail caught in a crab trap. Her injuries caused the loss of her tail, and the aquarium fitted her with a prosthetic tail, which brought worldwide attention to the facility. Winter later starred in the 2011 film *Dolphin Tale*, and the sequel, *Dolphin Tale 2*, was shot partially on location at the aquarium. Unfortunately, in November of 2021, Winter passed away, but her legacy lives on at the aquarium, where visitors can view her memorabilia, including her iconic prosthetic tail and memorabilia from her movies that honor her remarkable life and the inspiration she brought to millions.

The Fred Marquis Pinellas Trail is a rail-trail that stretches from Tarpon Springs in the north to St. Petersburg in the south, passing through the towns of Palm Harbor, Dunedin, Belleair, Clearwater, Largo, Seminole, South Pasadena, and Gulfport. The Trail, created along a portion of an abandoned railroad corridor is a multi-use trail everyone can enjoy. It provides a unique, protected greenspace for walking, jogging, skating, and biking, and skating. Some trail users are able to commute to work using the Pinellas Trail instead of a motor vehicle. The distance that the main trail currently covers is 47 miles. The Pinellas Trail was named after Fred Marquis, a former Pinellas County Administrator who served from 1979 until 2000. CLEARWATER HISTORY

The area which now is Clearwater was first visited by the white men in 1528.

This was 37 years before St. Augustine (1565), 79 years before Jamestown (1607), and 92 years before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock (1620). Panfilo de Narvaez, a Spanish explorer, landed on this shore on April 15, 1528, with

five ships, 40 horses, and 600 men.

De Narvaez's landing ranks second
only to that of Ponce de Leon, whose
discovery of Florida in 1513 marked the
beginning of the explorations of the
North American continent. De Narvaez
found here a large tribe of Indians,
which his army drove out. The Indians
recaptured their territory, however, and

held it until conquered in the Seminole Wars of 1835-42.

Occasional white settlers had begun to move into the area by that time. The first was Dr. Odet Philippe, a French Count, who had been a surgeon in Napoleon's Navy. Dr. Philippe came with his family in the mid-1830s and







DUNEDIN

Richard L. Garrison was the first person given a land grant in Dunedin in 1852, only seven years after Florida became a state. The settlement was originally named Jonesboro by George Jones, the owner of the area mercantile, who put up a sign over his general store in 1870 that read "Jonesboro." It wasn't until a petition in 1882 by two Scottish merchants, J.o. Douglas and James Somerville, officially named the post office, then the town itself, Dunedin. The town became incorporated in 1899 and a city in 1925.

The name is taken from Scottish Gaelic Dùn Èideann, the Scottish Gaelic for Edinburgh. With a dock built to accommodate larger sailing vessels, Dunedin

became an important trading center and at one time it had the largest fleet of sailing vessels in the state.

built a "plantation" on the site, which is now Philippe Park.

Fort Harrison was built in 1841 on the bluffs overlooking the harbor, then called Clear Water Harbor, the present site of Clearwater. The fort was named for Gen. William Henry Harrison, who became President Harrison. It was used as an outpost encampment for soldiers stationed at Fort Brook (now Tampa), was abandoned when the wars ended a few months later, and the territory was then opened by the Federal Government for homesteading under the Armed Occupation Act. This meant that homesteads would be granted to settlers willing to bear arms for protection against the still-hostile Indians hiding in the area.

James Stevens was the first of the homesteaders, staking out the fort and its surrounding areas as his claim. He was granted the first land title in 1842. This was the real beginning of the Clearwater of today. For years, a plaque at the entrance of the famed "Brown Estate," on the waterfront bluff in Harbor Oaks, marked the site of Fort Harrison.

The early settlement,
which adopted the name
of Clear Water Harbor,
grew slowly for several
years as an agricultural
and fishing community.
Its only outside contacts
were made either by horse and buggy,


wagon, by foot to Tampa, or by sailboat 100 miles up the Gulf to Cedar Key.

The Indians who inhabited this area are said to have called it Pocotopsug, meaning clear water. It was so named because of the many springs of clear, fresh water that bubbled up along the shore, and even below the waterline at low tide. The Indians depended on these springs for their water supply, as did the early white settlers. The action of the tides and the "fills" in recent years have completely changed the shoreline and eliminated most of the springs.

The act creating Pinellas County was passed by the State Legislature in May 1911. Clear Water Harbor was incorporated in 1891 and was chartered as a municipality on May 27, 1915.

INDIAN ROCKS

The origin of the name "Indian Rocks" is shrouded in the mists of time, but the most commonly offered explanation relates to the miraculous healing of native Indian Chief Chic-a-Si.

According to the legend, the chief, who lived in the Ocala region, contracted an illness so severe that members of his village feared death was near. An old friend of Chic-a-Si's named Chief Nu-Wa recommended that he be taken to a healing spring near some large rocks along the coast to the southwest.

The chief was carried to a rocky campsite along the Narrows to be near the spring, which legend says was the old sulfur spring that once flowed in what is now Kolb Park. That spring was capped years ago due to its unpleasant odor.

Chief Chic-a-Si drank heartily of the mineral waters from the spring and quickly regained his health. After that, the Indians returned to the site each year to drink from the miraculous spring and fish in local waters.


The legend concludes that early settlers to the area, observing the Indians' pilgrimage to "the rocks,"

originated the term Indian Rocks as an apt description for their settlement.

The Chic-a-Si story is one version of how Indian Rocks got its name. Another simpler legend tells about the Indians crossing over from the mainland to the island to fish along the shore. They chose a narrow spot to cross, where rocks protruding from the water made it easy for them to walk across to the island. So the rocks became known as Indian Rocks.

While neither legend has been documented, both offer a picturesque and plausible explanation for how our slice of paradise got its enduring title: Indian Rocks Beach.

LARGO CITY HISTORY

The area now known as Pinellas County was first inhabited by the Timucua Indians, one of four tribes in Florida. The Timucuans cultivated cornfields, constructed substantial homes, and were very involved in trading with the tribes of the north. When Spanish explorer Panfilo de Narvaez landed on the Pinellas Peninsula in 1528, he met great resistance from the Timucuans, and he and his crew suffered the ravages of storms, hunger, and exposure, which decimated the exploring party. Only four men found their way back to Spanish settlements in Mexico. Over the next 300 years, various parties of French and Spanish explorers attempted to settle the area, with little success. In fact, it wasn't until 1823 that Count Odet Phillippe, a surgeon in Napoleon's army, became the first permanent settler in Pinellas County.

A steady stream of settlers moved to the area throughout the 1800s, including such notable families as the Taylors, McMullens, Wilcoxes, and Belchers. It was 1886 when the Orange Belt Railroad was coming through the area that residents came together to give their community a name. It seemed that the railroad would only build a station if the stop had a name. Some residents wished to name the town after the daughter of a prominent resident, Gideon Blitch – Luluville. But ultimately they chose to name their town Largo, after the town's large lake. (In an ironic twist, the lake which gave name to Largo was completely drained by the Cross Bayou Drainage District 50 years later.) Others argue that Largo gained its name from the city of Largo, Scotland, where several of the area's settlers came from. Because of its central location and rich farmlands, Largo quickly became the center of the




area's citrus industry, earning the title "Citrus City." Largo citrus was being shipped by the ton to eager customers in the North.

The town was officially incorporated in 1905, and in 1913 became the first town in Florida – and second in the nation – to adopt a town manager form of government. The town grew rapidly through the boom times of the 1920s but was hit hard by a freeze in the latter part of the decade, and then by the Great Depression. Due to mounting debt, the City of Largo was contracted to its original 1905 boundaries and once again became the Town of Largo.

When World War II veterans returned home, they quickly discovered the joys of living on Florida's Suncoast, previously only known to the local farmers and a few rich vacationers, brought to the area on the rail lines built by Henry Flagler and Henry Plant. The population boomed, growing from just 1,500 residents in 1950 to over 5,300 ten years later. An unexpected freeze in 1962 dealt a serious blow to Largo's agricultural industry, and as groves were sold off, developers were quick to move in to build homes for a growing population. By 1970, Largo's population reached more than 22,000, and a new city was born.

Choosing a contractor for your construction project can be a little frightening to some. So, here are a few tips on choosing a contractor from the Pinellas County Building Services website.

TIPS ON CHOOSING A CONTRACTOR:

- Ask to see their license, and call the appropriate licensing agency to verify the licensee is in good standing, the status of the license, and insurance.
- Ask for and verify references from past customers.
- Check with the Pinellas County Consumer Protection, local Chamber of Commerce, and the Better Business Bureau.
- Get a written estimate from several licensed contractors. Be sure that the estimate includes all work to be done by the contractor, the materials involved, the date of completion, and the total cost.
- If the project is for repairing damage, check with your insurance company first to verify that your insurance will cover the repairs before you sign a contract.
- An occupational license or business tax receipt
 (BTR) is not sufficient in the construction trades.
- Beware of contractors or alleged contractors who ask to be paid in cash, ask for large payments upfront, or ask for you as the homeowner to pull the permit.

AFTER YOU CHOOSE A CONTRACTOR:

- Make sure your contractor obtains a permit and posts it on the front of the property.
- If the contractor request a final payment before all final inspections are completed and the permit

- placard has been signed by the appropriate inspectors, request that he/she obtains all final inspections prior to your final payment. However, you must abide by your contract.
- Make sure your contractor provides you with releases of liens from his subcontractors and suppliers.





BEFORE SIGNING A CONTRACT, BE CERTAIN YOUR CONTRACT INCLUDES:

- The contractor's name, street address, telephone number, and state or local license number.
- A precise description of the work to be completed, including a draw schedule and a list of materials.
- Completion date, including cleanup after work is finished.
- Warranty agreements, including length, terms, and recourse.
- A notice of consumers' rights under the Florida Homeowners' Construction Recovery Fund for contracts involving general, residential, and building contractors.
- Read your contract carefully and personally fill in any blank spaces.
 Consider having an attorney review the contract. If you do not have an attorney the Florida Bar offers a lawyer referral services.

BEWARE OF UNLICENSED CONTRACTORS:

- If you are planning to build a new home, a room addition, add on a second story, begin remodeling on your home, or have work done that requires a building permit, take care to select a qualified person to perform the work. Under state and local ordinances, any person you hire under contract (verbal or written) to perform construction on your property must be a licensed contractor. The contractor must be state-certified or registered. All printed advertising material such as business cards, newspaper ads, and telephone book ads must show his or her state license number.
- Beware of anyone that asks you to obtain the building permit as an "owner/builder"; this may indicate that they themselves are not properly licensed to obtain the permit.
- Also, beware of people that claim that you will save quite a bit
 of money by not obtaining a permit. A permit will only lead to
 compliance with the appropriate building codes; these are only
 minimum requirements.
- Unlicensed contractors do not have insurance coverage. Any injury that occurs on your property will be a claim against your insurance.
- If you wish to check on the license of an individual you can call the Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board at (727) 582-3100. Additionally, you can contact the Pinellas County Building Department at 464-3888.









LOCAL > TURTLES



During this time, female sea turtles come ashore to lay their eggs in the sand, where they incubate for about two months before the hatchlings emerge and make their way to the sea. It's important to be mindful of sea turtle nesting areas and to take precautions to keep them safe.





HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO KEEP IN MIND WHEN VISITING THE BEACHES DURING NESTING SEASON:

- 1. Respect the marked nesting areas Do not disturb any area that's marked as a nesting site. These areas are carefully monitored to ensure the safety of the eggs and hatchlings.
- 2. Avoid using lights on the beach at night Sea turtles are easily disoriented by artificial lights, which can cause them to lose their way and become prey to predators. It's best to avoid the use of flashlights and other lighting sources during nesting season.
- 3. Don't leave trash on the beach Trash and debris can be dangerous to sea turtles, who can become entangled and injured. Always dispose of trash and litter in proper receptacles.
- 4. Follow beach regulations Many beaches have specific regulations regarding behavior on the beach, such as no pets or no vehicles.

Make sure to follow these regulations to ensure the safety of the sea turtles. By following these tips, newcomers to Pinellas County can help protect the sea turtles that make their home on the beautiful beaches of this area. Remember, these stunning creatures are an important part of our ecosystem and deserve our respect and protection.


